### Message from the President and Executive Director

We have spent the last year reinforcing a strong organizational foundation, engaging in meaningful conversations with our stakeholders, and positively impacting 8,689 children, youth, adults, and seniors. This is a 4.5% increase in the number of people we have assisted over the previous year. We do this work in partnership with all of you. Thank you!

Our core work remains strong, with an increased demand for services at our I hope family centres, a high demand for counselling services, an increased number of visits to our Jessie's Legacy eating disorders prevention and awareness website, our award winning YouthLAB volunteers, over 700 requests for Christmas Bureau hampers, and many seniors in need of support during transitions and at the end of life.

We also continue to evolve our programming in new and effective ways based on feedback from those seeking help. We created two drop-in groups: one for (gender diverse) transgender youth and another for their parents. Transgender youth are 30% more likely to commit suicide than other youth. We knew we must act to reduce this risk and support these vulnerable families.

In partnership with UBC Eng-cite and Geering Up programs, we created a pilot program to support underprivileged children and youth in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) through workshops at Carson Graham Secondary and Queen Mary Elementary schools. We believe all children deserve the same opportunities regardless of socio-economic status.

We have also just completed our fourth reaccreditation with the Council on Accreditation, confirming our adherence to the highest ethical, service delivery, financial, performance, quality improvement, human resources, risk, and other standards, which gives us tremendous confidence going into our next year.

This year, we began work on a new strategic plan which will be approved in June 2017. Our Board of Directors determined it was time to look deeply at our core identity, strategic direction, strategic advantages, and other big questions in order to set ambitious priorities for the next five years. We engaged staff, volunteers, community leaders, government, and other stakeholders in the process. Our progress to date is summarized within this annual report.

All that we have done this year and our work to prepare for the next five years is a result of the generous support of our donors, funders, and volunteers. On behalf of our Board of Directors and Staff, we thank you for your sustaining commitment to Family Services of the North Shore.

### Our clinical counselling programs



#### Stopping the Violence Program

Individual and group counselling for women 19+ who have experienced relationship abuse, sexual assault and/or physical, emotional or sexual abuse at any age.

#### Family Preservation and Support Programs

Helping children and youth heal from abuse, trauma, or mental health issues - and increase their coping skills for a happier, healthier life.

#### Group Counselling

Inclusive, interactive and support group counselling can enhance individual therapy. Groups include

#### Helping You, Help Yourself

A group for men who are trying to eliminate abusive and violent behaviours in their relationships

#### **Caring Dads**

A group for dads to improve their parenting skills and abilities. The program is organized around four therapeutic goals: engaging men; building positive parenting; recognizing and countering abuse; and rebuilding trust with children.

#### Women and Anger

A group for women to explore their relationship with anger.

#### Surviving Parenthood

A drop-in group for parents based on building resiliency.

#### Trauma-Informed Family Support group

A group where women can gain trauma-informed support around parenting and access concrete resources.

With your generous and ongoing support we are able to continue to offer high quality programs and services which have a positive impact within our community.

#### Sparking a passion for STEM

Last year, we partnered with UBC Eng-cite (a professorship working to promote the field of engineering to young women) and Geering Up UBC Engineering & Science for Kids, which is a non-profit organization with the mandate of promoting science engineering and technology to youth across British Columbia.

Together, we developed a pilot program to support underprivileged children and youth with a series of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) workshops at Queen Mary Elementary and Carson Graham Secondary schools. Our goal is to ensure that all children and youth see the fun and opportunities of STEM fields – regardless of their gender, culture, ethnicity, and socioeconomic status. We also support our partners' special outreach for groups traditionally underrepresented in the sciences.

### Our new projects



#### Gender Diversity Support Program

We have one of the only gender diversity support groups that operates as a weekly drop-in program. This much-needed new initiative provides support for parents and youth through drop-in groups and individual counselling. Our two groups include:

**Be Yourself drop-in group for youth** A safe space for queer, transgender, two-spirited and questioning youth to connect and share their experiences with gender identity.

**Parenting Gender Diverse Youth drop-in group** A place for parents to build resiliency skills and access resources and support that are specific to parenting gender diverse youth. Parents are able to speak with other parents, and learn how to support their youth.

## Connecting seniors across our communities

Allies in Aging is a collaborative partnership working to connect seniors across our communities through leadership, outreach, transportation, training and advocacy. Projects are designed to connect seniors ages 75 and over with helpful people and services, in order to reduce isolation due to disability, low income, language or cultural barriers. Four lead partners are working with more than 20 additional partners to bridge geography and organizational diversity through strategic alignment.

#### **Seniors Hubs**

Supporting seniors' leadership in program design and delivery helps reach a significant number of isolated seniors.

#### Welcoming Spaces

#### Seniors on the Move

Transportation can be a significant obstacle for a senior wanting to connect with friends and family, participate in social programs, or even get out in the community for ordinary activities like shopping.

Training can help volunteers and service providers better identify seniors who are isolated, understand their needs, and connect them with appropriate services and resources. ### Strategic plan

#### 2017 Performance & Quality Improvement Report

The Agency is accredited with the Council on Accreditation (COA). To be accredited means that our Agency is measured against social service organizations' best practice standards and is found to meet or exceed those standards. We chose to be accredited by COA because it accredits the entire Agency, including governance, finance, human resources, training and supervision, service delivery and more.

Every four years we go through a robust process to demonstrate our continued compliance with these standards. The Agency has just completed its fourth accreditation cycle, which culminated in a visit by a team of COA peer reviewers. They commented on the Agency's strong clinical file maintenance system as well as our continued focus on good governance, our strategic planning process and our financial accountability.

The reviewers were particularly impressed with the Agency's Christmas Bureau, Companioning Continuing Care and Jessie's Legacy programs and how these programs support those most vulnerable members of our community. We were delighted when one of our peer reviewers said that we were the kind of Agency from which she would want her own children and grandchildren to receive service. We are currently awaiting the final report that confirms our accreditation status for the next four years.

### Message from the Board Treasurer



We successfully fundraised \$1.6 million through generous donations and grants from many individuals, corporations, and foundations, as well as through our signature events. I am very pleased to report that Family Services of the North Shore (Agency), and Family Services of the North Shore Foundation (Foundation) continued to maintain strong financial positions this year. We have concluded the fiscal year ended March 31, 2017 with a surplus of \$146,561 being held in the Foundation, and this provides us with a secure financial base going forward into our next fiscal vear.

We are very thankful for all of the financial support we received from our donors, funders and partners. We received continued support from the Government of Canada, the Province of British Columbia, the City of North Vancouver, the District of North Vancouver, the District of West Vancouver, and the United Way of the Lower Mainland. We successfully fundraised \$1.6 million through generous donations and grants from many individuals, corporations, and foundations, as well as through our signature events – Winter Family Ball, Christmas on the Shore, and Beer by the Pier. We are so grateful for all of this support, which helps us continue to serve those in our community through all of our specialized programs.

Total revenues for the Agency were higher than the previous year, reflecting the addition of a new three-year contract with Employment and Social Development Canada for the Volunteers as Navigators and Connectors project (Allies in Aging), as well as one-time-only funding from the Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD) for program enhancements and training, of which a portion was directed via flow-through transfer payments to other agencies.

Total expenses for the Agency were higher than the previous year reflecting the additional transfer payments directed to other agencies for MCFD, as well as the Allies in Aging partners. Additional expenses were also incurred for the strategic planning process, staff development and specialized training, as well as program and other expenses. These expenditures will help set a good foundation going forward into the coming years.

The market value of our investments, primarily the Family Services of the North Shore Foundation Investment Fund (Fund) held at the Vancouver Foundation, rebounded from last year's decline. As a result, an accounting gain on investments was recorded in the Foundation at year-end. We were pleased to be able to make an additional contribution to the Fund this year, which generates ongoing distribution payments throughout the year, and provides a financial cushion for times of economic uncertainty.

Our fundraising target for 2017-18 is \$1.7 million. We are confident that with your support we will achieve our goal to continue to offer programs and services that will have a positive impact within our community.
